Resumption of OAV registration in India: going steady

India's Filipino communities in New Delhi, Goa and Mumbai got heady doses of information tours from the Embassy led by Consul General Maria Agnes M. Cervantes. She headed the team in promoting the OAV registration exercise as well as the 2013 national elections to the Filipinos in these cities. The consular outreach in Goa and Mumbai were held from 16 to 22 November.
